On Friday the 18th of October our team met up with Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service Watch Commander Kevin Gilbert. Kev gave us an informative tour of the Whittlesey fire station and answered our questions on what it's like to work in the fire service.

WITH THE FIRE SERVICE

What Type of Jobs do you have to go out to?

We're called out to a variety of different jobs each day. No day is ever the same. We have call outs for Fires, RTC, Animals and many other rescue operations. We also spend a lot of time interacting and supporting the community by giving advice on how best to protect homes and businesses from fires. We install smoke alarms and conduct training sessions at larger premises such as the football stadium, hire rise flats and historical buildings to ensure we are ready for any event should it happen.

what happens if you're called out?

At our Dogsthorpe fire station I have my own bedroom. Like you guys do at home. All the staff have a an alarm pager, that vibrates really loud and flashes. This is to ensure you wake up. All the kit is already laid out ready to go so that we are as efficient as we can be and we can get to an emergency as quickly as possible.

Do you have to do a lot of training?

Yes, we have to train a lot to ensure we are the best we can be and to ensure we are ready for any scenario. We have to test and check equipment regularly to ensure everything is working, so we are always busy when not attending emergencies.

Do you get much leisure time?

We do get some leisure time, most stations will have a TV so we can have a sit down and relax for a bit. When things like the World Cup are on then we sometimes get a little extra time in front of the TV. Some stations also have things like Pool tables too, but a lot of our time is taken up doing important training or paperwork tasks.

What do you keep in your lockers?

We keep our personal belongings inside and often a wash kit that we can access each shift. we have a shower on site so that after any emergency we have been out to, especially fires we are able to clean up. This isn't only due to being a bit sweaty but also to ensure we wash off any contaminants as these can cause health complications.


